## Report of the IYCF Training Programme

The National Trainers training programme was conducted in collaboration with MTPG & RIHS and RGGW & CH, Puducherry soon after getting the permission from the BPNI, New Delhi. It was started on 15<sup>th</sup> Feb 2016 with six participants and one course Director from BPNI, office Dr.K.P.Kushwaha. He started the session with Introduction of the Training Programme, How BPNI was started and different training under BPNI etc. Then the sessions were divided among the six trainee by the course director. Preparatory sessions were taken by the trainees under supervison of the course director. All the clinical sessions were supervised by the course director . there was a post clinical discussion session with the course director and the trainees. The six day course end on 20<sup>th</sup> Feb 2016. On this day our director has divided again the sessions among six of us to continue the training for 24 participants of IYCF counseling specialist course.

The 4 in 1 IYCF couselling specialist course started from 22<sup>nd</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> Feb 2016 at RGGW&CH in collaboration with MTPG & RIHS. Programme started with Inauguration. All the Govt. officials are present during the Inauaguration. Director of Health and Family welfare, Puducherry, Director of NRHM, Puducherry, Medical superintendent, Dean, RMO, Chief Matron etc. MOU was exchanged between MTPG & RIHS and BPNI in presence of all the officials during the Inauguration. Further there was a request to the govt. officials to give time for detail discussion of the project during the training period. Director in his speech assured to conduct the training programme and asked the details about the programme in paper.

After the formal Inauguration, the first day programme was started with pre-test, then with the self introduction of the participants. Followed by 1<sup>st</sup> session by Dr K.P. Kushwaha, Course Director on setting up IYCF Counselling and support Center. 2<sup>nd</sup> session why optimal infant and young child feeding by Dr.Manjubala Dash, 3<sup>rd</sup> session on production and intake of breast milk by Dr Supriya.K.Vinod, 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> session on assessing a breastfeed & Observing breast feeding taken by Dr Prasana.T & Dr.Kayalvizhi. Balamurugan in two different batches in two classroom simultenously and the last session was by Prof.Gowri Sayee Jagadish on learning and listening skills with role play.

The second day 23.02.2016 programme was started by prayer and reporter of the first day. All the participants were given the exercise on learning and listening skills and this was facilitated by all the trainers. After completion of the exercise the session on breast conditions was held by Dr.Supriya.K.Vinod . Preparation for clinical practice I done by Dr.Jayestri Kurushev. All the participants were divided into six groups. So each group lead by one trainer with four participants. All the participants went to the wards for clinical practice session I on observation of the breast feeding. After their clinical practice there was a discussion by all the participants with all the trainers and course Director. There was a presentation by the participants i.e representatives from each group. Next session was on building confidence, giving support and checking understanding by Dr. Manjubala Dash followed by exercise facilitated by all trainers. The last session of the day was held on not enough milk by Dr.Kayalvizhi balamurugan and Dr.Jayestri Kurushev in two different batches in two different class rooms simultenously., then there was a video show on helping the mothers to breast feed.

3<sup>rd</sup> day 24.02.2016 session was started with prayer, reporter of 2<sup>nd</sup> day. The session on breast feeding positioning was taken by prof.Gowri Sayee Jagadish followed by there was an exercise on breast conditions facilitated by all trainers. Then there was clinical practice session II on building confidence,

giving support and checking understanding followed by group discussion by the participants with the trainers. After lunch the session on refusal to breast feed was taken by Dr. Prasanna T followed by exercise facilitated by all trainers. The last session was on taking a feeding history by Dr. Jayestri Kurushev.

Fourth day session was started with prayer and rapporter of 3<sup>rd</sup> day. First session was started by Dr. Jayestri Kurushev on expression of breast milk. Then history practice session was held by Dr.Manjubala Dash and all the participants are divided in six groups facilitated by each trainer. Clinical practice III was held on taking a feeding history followed by discussion by the trainers. Next session was on complimentary feeding by Dr. Kayalvizhi Balamurugan, and quantity, variety and frequency of complimentary feeding by Dr.Prasanna T, demonstration done by Dr Manju and Prof Gowri, facilitated by all Trainers, feeding techniques and strategy held by Dr supriya.K.Vinod. There was a demonstration on homemade foods and complimentary foods. There was a role play on counseling to the mother and also self feeding to the child. The last session was held by Dr.Jayestri Kurushev on Growth Monitoring, taking weight, length and height.

The day 5<sup>th</sup> was started with prayer, rapporter of 4<sup>th</sup> day. First session was started by Dr Supriya on BFHI, then preparation for clinical practice session IV on counseling the mothers in different situation and filling dietary recall form followed by discussion by the trainers. Next session was held by Dr Manju on Overview of HIV and infant feeding then Prof Gowri had taken the session on breast feeding options for HIV positive mothers and replacement feeding during the first six months taken by Dr.Kayalvizhi. The session on preparation of milk feeds was taken by Dr. Prasanna and Dr. Kayalvizhi in two groups. Each group has prepared formula milk and cow's milk and direct heat treat preparation of milk. After the practical session on preparation of milk, all were assembled in the main hall and a discussion was held on the practical difficulty faced for preparation of the milk. Then the session on counseling mothers with flip chart was handled by Dr. Jayestri and the last session on feeding during illness and recovery by Dr. Prasanna.

On the 6<sup>th</sup> day, the programme was started with as usual prayer and reporter of 5<sup>th</sup> day. The first session was a group work exercise 32 and 24 on counseling practice stories in six divided groups, which was facilitated by all the trainers. Then the participants were prepared for clinical practice session V and taken to the pediatric wards, OPD, NICU etc to have their practice on growth monitoring and counseling on complementary feeding. After clinical practice all had discussion with the trainers. The session on counseling for HIV positive mothers for feeding options was conducted by Dr Supriya. Further the growth monitoring and taking action session was held with six divided groups, facilitated by all trainers.

Day 7 was beginning with prayer and reporter of the 6<sup>th</sup> day. First session started with Prof. Gowri on IMS Act and sustaining optimal IYCF by Dr. prasanna, feeding LBW and Sick Babies by Dr. Supriya and Infant feeding in Emergency situation by Dr. Manju, Increasing breast milk and relactation by Dr. Jayestri, women nutrition and health by Prof. Gowri and women and work by Dr.Kayalvizhi. at last partipants were divided into three groups according to their state like Karnataka, Puducherry and all others in one group like Odisha, Tamilnadu and Andhra Pradesh. All these groups were facilitated by two trainers for future commitments. After 15mins discussion the group leaders were presented. From Karnataka state the leader was a nursing superintendent so she assured that she will implement all the good things like stating breastfeeding within half an hour of birth, cup feeding for LBW babies,

complementary feeding etc. she also said that they will conduct training for their hospital staffs. Many said they will think of opening a counseling center in their hospital. From Puducherry also the group leader said they will continue to work in some clinics, they will adopt a village for counseling the mothers, open own centre, conduct training to other staffs etc. from other states representatives also said same. There after evaluation chec-klist and clinical competence checklist was collected from all the participants,

The seven days' training programme was closed with a valedictory programme. Participants' feedback was very good about this training programme. Everybody said that it was very much useful and learned more skill to develop a programme in future and gained much more confidence during these 7 days. It is expected that they will utilize this skill development in their practice and the area wherever they are. There was some suggestions also given by the participants regarding this course like one week is not enough, it should be 15days course, practical sessions need to be more, then regarding timing of the training from 9am-5.30pm is too long.


